The first time I saw Diego's Flower Motif by Janie Crow, it seemed simple to me, but touched my heart with an abundance of colour combinations! I think Jane is the most famous designer, who gives us crafters, so many ideas and pushes us to the new horizons of unforgettable experiments and inspiration.

From the first minutes, the idea of crocheting a cushion so stuck in my brain that without delay, I proceeded with extraordinary zeal for its implementation.

I began to try. The first crochet motif was 1.1 and I immediately decided that it would be central of side A. The first thought was to name my version of the pillow - Spring and Summer Inspiration-. Therefore, for side A - Summer - I used summer colors for borders - juicy ripe grass and the wheat colour border. Yellow, orange and red - as a reminder of the bright summer flowers colours; added a little earth colour, as the basis for everything growing on the planet. I embellished the middle of each motif with bright beads, which emphasized the richness of the colour palette and makes the midpoints of the flowers unusually bright and full of life.

For the second side, I decided to add ripeness, so I crocheted the burgundy and wheat colours for the motif borders.

Having finished the pillow, I put it aside for several days, letting myself and it have a good rest. BUT! Like a mystic magnet, the cushion did not give me rest and demanded constant attention. And finally, I realized why. It looked like IMPERIAL and demanded a proper embellishment - colourful tassels embroidered with beads and something playful and light, so the idea of decorative crocheted wooden balls was born in my mind and very quickly materialized.

I went with cushion to my blossoming garden to take some pictures... and suddenly realized - I need to give it another name - ALADDIN – for it`s absolutely magic and bright fairy-tale fabulous look. I hugged it and made wish...





BORDER

When I finished all my crochet motifs, I put them together according to their layout. All the motifs were so vivid that I decided to emphasize their individuality by crocheting a border using the SIRDAR yarn. Ivory color enhanced contrast and gave each motif its own story.

Round 12: Using SIRDAR yarn crochet border for each motif. 3tr into the top of each corner of the hexagon motif and 1tr into each stich.

RHOMBUS

To form the sides, I decided to crochet 6 rhombuses with SIRDAR yarn and sewed them carefully on the wrong side using the same yarn thread stitch to stitch with the main motifs.

At the junction of the tops of rhombuses with the tops of the main motifs, I sewed crochet wooden beads using the same colour viscose sewing thread. This covered the seam and added the pillow an interesting additional decorative element.



BOTTOM BORDER

Using the right side, I crocheted the circle raw of dc stitches on the full perimeter of both sides. Then, on the wrong side, I connected each side together and crocheted 1dc to each stitch.

To the tops of each motifs I sewed 4 decorated crocheted wooden beads.

CLASP

For the clasp, I used 4 crocheted wooden beads.

I crocheted the upper border in the same way as a bottom border, but in this case I crocheted 4 chains for crocheted wooden beads (each chain consists of 6 loops) on the side A and sew 4 crocheted beads on the side B at the same position. Then, on the wrong side, I sewed both sides together before the center of each half-motif.

TASSELS

Make the ball using SIRDAR yarn

Round 1: make a magic loop, work 6dc into the loop, ss to join. (6sts)

Round 2: 1ch, 2dc into each st to end, ss to join. (12sts)

Round 3: 1ch, * 2dc into next st, 1dc into next st, repeat from * to end, ss to join. (18sts)

Round 4: 1ch, * 2dc into next st, 1dc into each next 2sts, repeat from * to end, ss to join. (24sts)

Round 5 -7: 1ch, 1dc into each st to end, ss to join. (24sts)

Round 8: (decrease)1ch, *dc2tog over next 2sts, 1dc into each next 2sts, repeat from * to end, ss to join. (18sts)

Round 9: (decrease) 1ch, *dc2tog over next 2sts, 1dc into next st, repeat to end, ss to join. (12sts)

Round 10: 1ch, 1dc into each st to end, ss to join. fasten off.

Sew 12 beads (B54) evenly around the last round using the image as a guide.

Make the tassel using colour M

Pull a tassel troughout the ball.

Pull the handle of the tassel throughout the hole in the top of the ball. Sew the handle of the tassel with the corner of the cushion.
