




The original Bohemian Blooms Crochet Blanket project was inspired by the work of artists Vanessa Bell and Duncan Grant of the Bloomsbury Set and in particular the interior decoration of their country home, Charleston Farmhouse, in East Sussex and the murals painted by them in the nearby Berwick Village church.

The original design features repeated crochet pieces, the patterns can be found in a beautiful soft back book, full of step-by-step images and background information. Given the amount of work that went into the designs for this project we felt there was more scope for designing different layouts in alternative yarns and so we have produced this new version of the blanket and named it Bloomsbury Garden.

Bloomsbury Garden uses six of the original motifs in a new layout that I feel echoes the idea of London's gated gardens, while maintaining the link to Charleston and the Church murals. Use this yarn substitution document as a guide alongside the book to create this new version of my very popular design.

Materials Yarn

Below is a list of the shades and quantities required for the new version of Bohemian Blooms Crochet Blanket:

Stylecraft Life DK – 100g, 298m (326yds), 75% Premium Acrylic, 25% Wool.

Cream (2305)	1 ball
Daffodil (2394)	1 ball
Fern (2311)	1 ball
Fuchsia (2344)	1 ball
Heather (2309)	1 ball
Ice Blue (2414)	1 ball
Olive (2302)	1 ball
Rose (2301) (We had 6g left so we have added one ball.)	2 balls

Stylecraft Life Changes - 100g, 298m (326yds), 75% Premium Acrylic, 25% Wool.

Roses (2701) 1 ball

Stylecraft Bellissima DK - 100g, 268m (293yds), 100% Premium Acrylic.

Bashful Blue (3930)	2 balls
Smoked Pearl (3929) (We had very little left	4 balls

so we have added one ball.)

Stylecraft Batik DK - 50g, 138m (151yds), 80% Premium Acrylic, 20% Wool.

Pistachio (1910)	1 ball

Equipment

3.5mm (US E/4), 4mm (US G/6) and 4.5mm (US 7) crochet hooks Sewing needle and thread for beading Stitch Markers Yarn Needle

Yarn Substitutions

The varn substitutions for the *Bloomsbury* Garden colour way are listed in the order of the pattern sets within the Bohemian Blooms Crochet Blanket book. The shade order for each block is given in the order they are worked.

Notes for making up and adding the edging for the new colour way are also included towards the end of this document.

Please note that in this version of the blanket stitch counts, bead amounts and measurements for **Unity** (page 6) differ to those of the original.



Instructions

Bloomsbury (make 4)

Note: To work the stripe sequence below you can keep yarns Bashful Blue and Ice Blue attached to the work throughout and carry them up the side edges between use. When working this piece we pre-cut lengths of Heather and Smoked Pearl so that we didn't have to cut yarn ends on lots of rows.

FOUNDATION ROW: Ice Blue.

- **ROW 1:** Ice Blue.
- **ROW 2:** Ice Blue.
- **ROW 3:** Ice Blue.
- **ROW 4:** Bashful Blue.
- **ROW 5:** Heather.
- **ROW 6:** Smoked Pearl.
- **ROW 7:** Bashful Blue.
- ROW 8: Ice Blue.

Outside Edge

- **FOUNDATION ROW:** Bashful Blue.
 - ROW 1: Bashful Blue.

ROW 3: Heather.

ROW 2: Roses (Life Changes).

- ROW 4: Bashful Blue.






Note: Life Changes is a yarn that features variegated dying. You may find (as we did) that your flowers come out in different shades. We like this effect and placed the flowers accordingly.







Bohemian Blooms Crochet Blanket



Key











Unity

Using the diagram as a guide join the central 25 crochet motifs using **Smoked Pearl** and **4mm** hook, working double crochet and matching stitch for stitch on the reverse side of the work, ensuring that corner stitch markers on all motifs line up. Sew in yarn ends.

Pre Blocked Measurement of joined motifs: approximately 89cm (35in) square

Beaded Frame (make 4)

Thread 154 **Pewter beads** onto **Smoked Pearl**. Push beads down the yarn so they are out of the way for the next row.

FOUNDATION ROW (RS FACING): Using yarn **Smoked Pearl** and **4mm** hook, working along edge of 5 motifs of the central panel, work a total of 179dc along one side edge (I worked 36dc along side edge of first and second motif, 35dc along the edge of the third motif and 36dc along the fourth and fifth motif), turn. (179 sts) Change to 3.5mm hook.

ROW 1: Smoked Pearl changing to **Fuchsia** on the final step of the last st, turn. (22 fans made – 223 sts)

Change to 4mm hook.

ROW 2 (RS FACING): Fuchsia and **4mm** hook (*223 sts*)

Change to 3.5mm hook.

ROW 3: Fern and **3.5mm** hook.

ROW 4: Fern changing yarn shade to **(Life Changes) Roses** on the final step of the last st, turn. (*181 sts*)

ROW 5: (Life Changes) Roses 1ch (does not count as a st), 1dc into st at base of 1ch, dc2tog over next 2sts, 1dc into each next 86sts, dc2tog over next 2sts, 1dc into each st to last 3sts, dc2tog over next 2sts, 1dc into next st, turn. (*178 sts*)

ROW 6: (Life Changes) Roses changing yarn shade to Rose on the final step of the last st, turn. (178 sts)
Change to 4mm hook.
ROW 7: Rose and 4mm hook (178 sts)
ROW 8: Rose, using Cream for bobbles. (20 bobbles made)
ROW 9: Rose



ROW 10: Rose, changing yarn shade to **Pistachio** on the final step of the last st, turn. (178 sts)

ROW 11: Pistachio changing yarn shade to **Smoked Pearl** on the final step of the last st, turn. (178 sts)

ROW 12: Smoked Pearl. (178 sts)

Sew in yarn ends.

Using **4.5mm** hook and **Smoked Pear**l and working with RS facing work 14 slip stitches along each side edge, fasten off.

Sew in yarn ends Work remaining three sides to match.





Making up

Using the diagram as a guide join four of the eight Omega Square motifs using yarn **Smoked Pearl** and **4mm** hook.

Edging

ROUND 1: Rose.
ROUND 2: Rose.
ROUND 3: Cream.
ROUND 4: Smoked Pearl.


