

Changing yarn on the right side of the work

Our example shows double crochet, but the same rules apply to all stitches.

Note

In the example right, two blocks of colour are going to be worked.



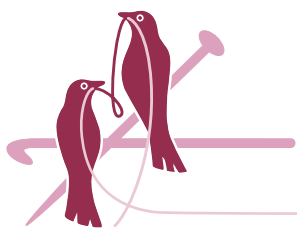
Step 1: Using the correct shade of yarn, work across the row until you are on the stitch before your colour change. Work your next stitch through to the final step – leaving two yarn loops on your hook.



Step 2: Complete your stitch using the next yarn shade so that the yarn loop on the hook is worked in the 'new' shade of yarn.



Step 3: Complete the next stitch and work to the end of the row as required.



Changing yarn shade on the reverse side of the work

JANIE CROW

Again, our example shows double crochet, but the same rules apply to all stitches.



Step 1: Using the correct shade of yarn, work across the row until you are on the stitch before your colour change. Work your next stitch through to the final step – leaving two yarn loops on your hook.



Step 2: Bring the yarn to the front of the work (towards you).



Step 3: Pick up the next shade of yarn.



Step 5: Holding the yarn at the back of the work in the usual way, complete the stitch so that the yarn loop on the hook is in the worked in the 'new' shade of yarn.



Step 6: Complete the next stitch and work to the end of the row as required.
