




How to read a crochet chart

- Each round is numbered as close as possible to the turning chain or first stitch of the round.
- If the work is turned at any point the direction of work is indicated. Otherwise work around the chart in an anticlockwise direction.
- Using the key, work each stitch in turn, into the place indicated by the direction of the symbol.



	Ss – Slip stitch
0	1ch – 1 Chain
+	Dc – Double Crochet
†	Dc – Double Crochet spike
T	Htr – Half Treble Crochet
Ŧ	Tr – Treble Crochet
¥	2tr into same st
1	Dtr – Double Treble Crochet

- Each round is coloured to indicate the yarn used. The colour may not be an exact match to the yarn but a shade that can be distinguished from the other yarns and can be seen.

 White yarn will often be indicated by a pale blue or an outlined symbol.
- If the worked is turned at any point the direction of work is indicated.
 Otherwise work around the chart in an anti-clockwise direction.
- The stitches are drawn to illustrate type and placement and this means that they may not be to scale and may be drawn for clarity.
