Yarn Substitution Document For Stylecraft DK

















My Indian Roses blanket design was inspired by a trip to Mysore, India where I came across some lovely vintage ceramic tiles that featured pretty roses at the centre. The original design was worked using woollen yarns from the West Yorkshire Spinners range, but you can use any DK weight yarn so long at it crochets to the same tension and is equal in length.

The Stylecraft yarn brand is a favourite of mine so I have worked a new sample motif of the design as an alternative to the original. To work through this version, you will need the original pattern, which you can purchase either as a paper or a download copy, plus this yarn substitution document. You will need to refer to the original pattern for measurements, equipment needed and the pattern notes.

MATERIALS

Stylecraft Life DK

75% Premium Acrylic 25% Wool 298m (326yds) per 100g ball

Teal (2416)	4 balls
Olive (2302)	3 balls
Cream (2305)	2 balls
Aqua (2357)	1ball
Fern (2311)	1ball
Fuchsia (2344)	1ball
Mustard (2496)	1ball
Stylecraft Special DK	

Stylecraft Special DK

100% Premium Acrylic 295m (322yds) per 100g ball

Mocha (1064)	1 bal

Highland Heathers

100% Premium Acrylic 297m (272yds) per 100g ball

Wild Salmon (3745)	2 balls
Moss (3752)	1 ball

Please note that yarn amounts are approximate and are based on this order of substituting yarn and on using the correct tension.

INSTRUCTIONS

Main Motif (make 13)

- Using **Fuchsia** and **4mm hook** throughout make 4ch, join with a ss to form a ring.
- Round 1: Using Fuchsia.
- Round 2: Using Wild Salmon.
- Round 3: Using Moss.
- Round 4: Using Mustard.
- Round 5: Using Cream.
- Round 6 & 7: Using Fuchsia.
- Round 8: Using Wild Salmon.
- Round 9: Using Fuchsia.
- Round 10 & 11: Using Olive.
- Round 12: Using Fern.
- Round 13 & 14: Using Cream.
- Round 15: Using Mocha.
- Round 16: Using Teal.
- Round 17: Using Aqua.
- Round 18: Using Moss.
- Round 19, 20 & 21: Using Olive.
- **Round 22, 23 & 24:** Using **Teal**.

Half Motif (make 8)

Using **Fuchsia** and **4mm hook** throughout make 4ch, join with a ss to form a ring.

- Row 1: Using Fuchsia.
- Row 2: Using Wild Salmon.
- Row 3: Using Moss.
- Row 4: Using Mustard.
- Row 5: Using Cream.
- Row 6 & 7: Using Fuchsia.
- Row 8: Using Wild Salmon.
- Row 9: Using Fuchsia.
- Row 10 & 11: Using Olive.
- Row 12: Using Fern.
- Row 13 & 14: Using Cream.
- Row 15: Using Mocha.
- Row 16: Using Teal.
- Row 17: Using Aqua.
- Row 18: Using Moss.
- Row 19, 20 & 21: Using Olive.
- Row 22, 23 & 24: Using Teal.

Quarter Motif (make 4)

- Using **Fuchsia** and **4mm hook** throughout make 4ch, join with a ss to form a ring.
- Row 1: Using Fuchsia.
- Row 2: Using Wild Salmon.
- Row 3: Using Moss.

- Row 4: Using Mustard.
- Row5: Using Cream.
- Row 6 & 7: Using Fuchsia.
- Row 8: Using Wild Salmon.
- Row 9: Using Fuchsia.
- Row 10 & 11: Using Olive.
- Row 12: Using Fern.
- Row 13 & 14: Using Cream.
- Row 15: Using Mocha.
- Row 16: Using Teal.
- Row 17: Using Aqua.
- Row 18: Using Moss.
- Row 19, 20 & 21: Using Olive.
- Row 22, 23 & 24: Using Teal.

Making Up

Using **Teal** and **4mm hook**.

Edging

- Round 1 & 2: Using Mocha.
- Round 3: Using Teal.
- Round 4: Using Aqua.

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
